GENERAL APPEARANCE/CLEANLINESS/COMMENTS OF THE FACILITY:

Living Area:

Living areas are clean and offender belongings stored properly.

Dorms:

The jail does not have dorms. The DOC offenders are housed separate from the pre-trail offenders. Living areas are clean and neat.

Cell Block:

The cellblock is used to house pre-trail offenders. This area is neat and clean.

Culinary/Dining:

There is no dining hall at the jail. The jail has a small cooking area where the food is prepared for the offenders housed at the jail. The kitchen area is clean food stored properly. Utensils are stored properly and on inventory. Cooler temperatures are recorded.

Bathrooms:

Bathrooms are clean and odor free and working properly. Adequate hot water available. Shower facilities available for offender use in living areas.

Yard Areas:

There is no fenced in area at the jail. The jail is located at the courthouse. There is a small area where the offenders can go and exercise. Yard area around the courthouse and jail is neat and clean.

Maintenance

There is no maintenance department located at the jail. Any maintenance is reported to the Police Jury and they handle any repairs as needed.

REVIEW AND COMMENT ON THE FOLLOWING BASIC JAIL GUIDELINES: (Compliant or Non-Compliant)

I-A-001 Safety/Sanitation/Inspections-Compliant DHH inspection done 6/01/21 with no violations. DHH retail food inspection done 6/01/21 with violations corrected on site. (COS). FM inspection done 3/03/21.

I-C-001 Emergency Plan-Compliant

Jail has an emergency plan in place and employees trained. A copy of the emergency plan will be submitted to the FM for approval.

- How many formal counts are conducted each shift? 2 per shift

Stick outs are counts that are conducted in areas other than housing units, such as food services and other areas of normally authorized locations. When conducting and submitting the counts, employees are to actually see the offender before turning in theses counts.

- How does the facility accomplish this? Offenders are physically counted by officers working in the jail. If an offender is on a work detail, he is signed out and the count verified by the officer responsible for the detail.
- Does this process insure accountability and safe/secure operation of the facility? Yes

Files are kept on offenders housed at the jail to include master prison record, criminal history, and disciplinary. DOC offenders and pre-trial offenders are housed separate.

Offenders are processed upon arrival and all belonging searched.

Offenders usually come from Lasalle Correctional Center to the jail that would eligible for trustee. The correctional facility screens the offenders prior to sending to the jail. Criminal history, release date, medical and mental status, disciplinary records are reviewed in order to consider the offender for trustee status.


At this time recertification with a waiver is recommended with continued annual monitoring visits.

NOTICE RS 40:31.38 (ACT 66)

RS 40:31.38 (ACT 66) authorizes the Louisiana Department of Health to charge a fee of \$150 to any permitted food establishment that fails to correct the necessary sanitary code violations to be in compliance at the time of its follow up inspection (1st reinspection). Re-inspections are required when there are five or more uncorrected non-critical violations and/or one or more uncorrected critical violations remaining at the conclusion of an inspection. The fee is only charged if the necessary violations are not corrected before the 2nd re-inspection and other subsequent re-inspections. Establishments can avoid this fee if the violations noted on the routine inspection report are corrected by, or during, the follow up inspection. If a fee is assessed, the \$150 fee is payable within 30 days' notice, and failure to pay shall result in revocation of the permit.
