Please see the attached monitoring report regarding the Basic Jail Guidelines (BJG) annual inspection that was conducted at Catahoula Correctional Center on July 21, 2022. During the walk through of the living areas the following was noted:

- Dorm Offender property on bed area and hanging from beds.
- Cellblock –There were cells with trash and needed to be cleaned, offender property on floor or on bed due to lack of storage.
- Bathrooms Were in need of cleaning.

DPS&C would like to encourage full compliance with BJG I-A-004 "Housekeeping". <u>At this time DPS&C will return in 60 days for a major audit and complete inspection of each BJG Standard.</u>

## GENERAL APPERANCE, CLEANLINESS, AND COMMENTS OF THE FACILITY:

#### Living Area:

• **Dorms** – The dorms have several mattresses that are cracked or no outer covering. Offender belongings were in the drawer attached to the beds but also on the bed area. Some items are hanging from the beds.

• Cell Block – The cells have some trash and need to be cleaned. Offender belongings are on the floor or on the bed due to no locker box or storage drawer in the cells.

**Culinary/Dining**: The kitchen and dining areas are clean. The lunch meal was being prepared during the walk through. Utensils are in a locked cabinet and on inventory. Utensils are being signed in and out. Cooler/freezer temperatures, hot water temperatures for the dish washer are all checked and logged. Menus are posted.

**Bathrooms**: The bathroom and shower areas in the dorms need some cleaning. The facility will be in the process of doing work to the shower areas.

Yard Areas: The yards are neat and clean. Offenders use the yards for recreation purposes.

**Maintenance**: The maintenance building is behind the facility. The tools are in a locked cage and on shadow board. Tools are on inventory and signed in and out.

Spoke to staff in different areas during the walk through of the facility. Staff is knowledgeable of job duties. Staff morale appeared to be good with employees working together to carry out the daily operations of the facility. Staff is aware of the mattresses in the housing units in poor condition and have replaced some mattresses and will be replacing more. The staff also stated that they will be doing some work to the dorm shower areas also.

#### OFFENDER COMMENTS/MORALE/QUALITY OF LIFE:

Spoke to offenders in different dorms during the walk through. No offender voiced concern or problems. Offender quality of life appears to be good. Offenders are assigned beds and not sleeping on the floor. Beds have mattress, sheet and blankets.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

At this time continued annual monitoring visits are recommended.

#### NOTICE RS 40:31.38 (ACT 66)

RS 40:31.38 (ACT 66) authorizes the Louisiana Department of Health to charge a fee of \$150 to any permitted facility that fails to correct the necessary sanitary code violations to be in compliance at the time of its follow up inspection (1st re-inspection). Re-inspections are required when there are five or more uncorrected non-critical violations and/or one or more uncorrected critical violations remaining at the conclusion of an inspection. The fee is only charged if the necessary violations are not corrected before the 2nd re-inspection and other subsequent re-inspections. Facilities can avoid this fee if the violations noted on the routine inspection report are corrected by, or during, the follow up inspection. If a fee is assessed, the \$150 fee is payable within 30 days' notice, and failure to pay shall result in revocation of the permit.
