

Please see the attached monitoring report regarding the Basic Jail Guidelines (BJG) follow-up inspection that was conducted at Avoyelles Detention Center on February 3, 2023.

The following improvements were noted during this inspection:

- Quarterly Healthcare meeting was held to be in compliance with guideline IV-D-001;
- Torn mattresses have been replaced, with more on order;
- Repairs have been made to floor drain in Dorm A;
- Repairs made to doors in the lockdown area; and
- Cleaning/housekeeping was better than the August 18, 2022 inspection.

DPS&C would like to encourage full compliance with BJJ I-A-004 "Housekeeping". At this time DPS&C is recertifying Avoyelles Detention Center in compliance with the Basic Jail Guidelines with semiannual monitoring.

Congratulations to you and you staff on this accomplishment and thank you for your hard work and dedication that are necessary to achieve this goal.

GENERAL APPERANCE, CLEANLINESS, AND COMMENTS OF THE FACILITY:

Living Area:

Dorms - A walk through was conducted in all dorms at the facility.

- A-Dorm**
 8/18/22 - Some of the offender belongings are on the bed areas and not all stored in metal locker boxes due to limited number of boxes for offenders. The facility staff advised they are in the process of reducing the amount of personal belongings offenders can have due to storage. Several mattresses are torn or have no outer protective covering. Staff advised they have replaced some mattresses and more are being ordered to continue to replace more mattresses. Mostly parish and pre-trial offenders housed in this dorm.
 2/03/23 - Offenders have less belongings to be stored and all issued orange clothing to wear. Several mattresses have been replaced since the 8/22 inspection. There are still some mattresses that are torn.
- B-Dorm**
 8/18/22 - This dorm was clean and organized. This dorm houses the facility trustees and some offender workers and will be used to house offenders in the event the facility gets approved for TWP. Offender belongings stored properly.
 2/03/23 - The dorm is clean and belongings stored properly.
- C-Dorm**
 8/18/22 - This dorm was clean. There are some mattresses in this dorm that are in need of being repaired or replaced also. Offenders in this dorm are issued orange clothing from the facility to wear. It was noted upon entry into the dorm. Some painting has been done and the dorm was cleaner than previous visits.

2/03/23 - Some mattresses have also been replaced in this dorm. Still have a few mattresses to be replaced in this dorm.

- D-Dorm

8/18/22 - This dorm was clean. There are some mattresses in this dorm that are in need of being repaired or replaced also. Offenders in this dorm are issued orange clothing from the facility to wear. It was also noted upon entry into the dorm. Some painting has been done and the dorm was cleaner than previous visits.

2/03/23 - Some mattresses have also been replace in this dorm. Still have a few mattresses to be replaced in this dorm. The officer had some trouble unlocking the rear exit door of this dorm. Maintenance was notified.

- E-Dorm

8/18/22 - This dorm was clean. This dorm houses mostly kitchen workers and other workers for the facility. Offender belongings were stored properly.

2/03/23 - This dorm was clean and belongings stored properly.

Cell Block – A walk through was conducted of all lock down areas.

- 8/18/22 - Several doors to the lock down areas are hard to open. Maintenance was present and made aware of the situation. Offender personal belongings are stored all over the bed area. There are no locker boxes in lock down to store belongings. Staff advised they are in the process of reducing the amount of belongings offenders will be allowed in the lockdown area.

2/03/23 - The doors to the lock down have been worked on and are opening easier now since the 8/22 inspection. Offender belongings are still all over the bed areas with no locker boxes to store belongings in. A couple of toilets in lock down were leaking or not working. Maintenance was notified and was present working on the toilets during the inspection.

Culinary/Dining:

8/18/22 - The kitchen and dining hall is clean. The dining hall is used for classes. During the walk through there was a CTRP class being taught. The kitchen workers were preparing to serve the noon meal and some were beginning to cook the evening meal. Cooler and freezer temperatures are checked and logged. Hot water temperature are checked for the dishwasher. Tools are on inventory and being signed in and out. There is a bathroom available in the kitchen for use. Food is stored properly and dated.

2/03/23 Kitchen was clean. The restroom in the kitchen area has been repaired and operational.

Bathrooms:

8/18/22 - Bathrooms are in working order. It was noted in A-Dorm that the floor drain in the sink and urinal area was stopped up and backed up on the floor. Several showers in the lock down are in need of some cleaning. Showers are on timers throughout the facility and only come on at certain hours of the day. This was done due to offenders leaving water running and using excessive amounts of water. Hot water is available and temperatures are logged. In D Dorm where the sink or toilet that was pulled off the wall where the offenders entered the pipe chase and escaped from the jail has been repaired. The facility has bolted a metal sheet on the wall behind the sinks and toilets so in the event a sink or toilet is pulled off again the offender cannot access the pipe chase.

2/03/23 - The floor drain in A-Dorm that was stopped up on the 8/22 inspection has been repaired. Some showers are still in need of cleaning.

Yard Areas: There is a yard area for recreation purposes located to the side of the jail. The yard area is clean.

Maintenance: The maintenance shop is located behind the facility in a separate building outside the secured area. Only offenders working in the maintenance shop have access to the shop. Tools are on inventory and signed in and out.

STAFF COMMENTS/MORALE/GENERAL OBSERVATIONS:

8/18/22 - Sheriff Dauzat along with other staff was present for the entire walk through of the jail. There have been improvements done throughout the jail from cleaning and painting and some maintenance concerns such as lighting has improved. Staff was courteous during the walk through. Staff morale appeared to be good. Sheriff Dauzat said they are working on more improvements at the jail.

OFFENDER COMMENTS/MORALE/QUALITY OF LIFE:

Spoke to offenders during the walk through. Offenders have access to kiosk in the dorms to communicate with family and have video visits. Offenders can also send a requests to administration. Some concern

was voiced by offenders in A-Dorm about the floor drain that was backing up and the showers not being on long enough. Other offenders were asking about TWP. No other concerns or comments were voiced by offenders. Offender morale and quality of life appeared to be good.

RECOMMENDATION:

Sheriff Dauzat, Chief Deputy Quibedeaux, Mr. Damion Jacobs and Warden Cazalot were present for the walk through. Improvements are an ongoing process at the jail. Since the 8/22 BJG inspection the facility has conducted a quarterly Healthcare meeting to be in compliance with IV-D-001. Also the stopped up floor drain in A-Dorm was repaired. The doors in lockdown have been worked on and are operating better. Some cleaning has been done but more is needed to be 100 percent compliant with I-A-001 Housekeeping. At the time, the monitoring team will recommend certification with visits every 6 months at this time.

ALSO THE STAFF KEPT TRYING MULTIPLE KEYS FOR DOORS TRYING TO GET THEM OPEN AND WAS UNSURE OF WHICH KEYS GO TO WHICH DORMS. ALSO IN DORM A, D, AND E THE REAR DOORS WILL NOT OPEN. IN DORM D THE STAFF FINALLY GOT THE REAR DOOR OPEN AFTER PICKING AN OBJECT OUT OF THE LOCK.

Response: Warden Cazlot and the shift supervisors are making frequent rounds and ensuring that this practice has been halted.



Response: All door problems were addressed and the procedure was authored that all rear doors are to be opened every Friday, both from the inside and exterior, with keys.

101 2015 22.4.5.1.4 The owner shall have staff trained so that keys will be available within 2 minutes to start the process of releasing doors. Currently the staff was unsure of which keys went to which doors and kept trying different keys to get doors open.

Response: The Warden and Director have put in place the procedure in which any time a different officer is placed on a drop that they will be instructed on the use of their assigned keys. All drops that have a rear exit door shall have that key on their key ring and will be trained on its use.

The Chief of Security shall now check all key rings once a week and send the report to the Corrections trailer Office for filing.

RS 40:31.38 (ACT 66) authorizes the Louisiana Department of Health to charge a fee of \$150 to any permitted facility that fails to correct the necessary sanitary code violations to be in compliance at the time of its follow up inspection (1st re-inspection). Re-inspections are required when there are five or more uncorrected non-critical violations and/or one or more uncorrected critical violations remaining at the conclusion of an inspection. The fee is only charged if the necessary violations are not corrected before the 2nd re-inspection and other subsequent re-inspections.
