Please see the attached monitoring report regarding the Basic Jail Guidelines (BJG) annual inspection that was conducted at Beauregard Parish Jail on July 28, 2023. The facility continues to provide a secure, safe, and stable environment for DOC offenders in their custody. However, BJG Team Leader Lt. Col. Chad Firmin did note there was no tool inventory or accountability of tools at the Maintenance Shop. The Warden and maintenance staff were advised of the importance of tool control and proper procedures to correct discrepancies. DPS&C would like to encourage full compliance with BJG II-D-001 "Key, Tool, and Utensil Control".

At this time DPS&C is granting wavier of the recertification process. Congratulations to you and your staff for this accomplishment and thank you for the hard work and dedication that are necessary to achieve this goal.

GENERAL APPERANCE, CLEANLINESS, AND COMMENTS OF THE FACILITY:

Living Area:

- **Dorms** The dorm areas are clean and offender belongings stored properly. All beds were made up according to policy and have mattresses and blankets provided.
- **Cell Block** The cells are clean. All cells have been completely repainted and new doors placed on all cells. There are no DOC offenders housed in restrictive housing.

Culinary/Dining: The facility does not have a dining hall. The kitchen area was clean. The kitchen has some new renovations to include a new scullery area and extended storage and cooler areas. The meals are prepared in the kitchen and placed in food carts and delivered to the living units. Kitchen utensils are on inventory and placed in a locked cabinet and signed in and out by staff. A menu is posted in the kitchen and in housing units and approved by a dietician.

Bathrooms: Bathroom and shower areas have been renovated throughout the facility. All bathroom and showers are in working condition. Adequate hot water is available in the showers.

Yard Areas: There are 2 yards for offender recreation. One basketball court and one volleyball court. The units are alternated each day to the different yards.

Maintenance: Maintenance is done by the Police Jury which is not located on the facility grounds. There is a mechanic shop located behind the facility outside the secure perimeter where the sheriff office vehicles

are repaired. There is no tool inventory or accountability of tools or FTC at the shop. The Warden along with staff working in the shop was advised the importance of tool control and accountability and what needed to be done to correct the issue.

REVIEW AND COMMENT ON THE FOLLOWING BASIC JAIL GUIDELINES: (Compliant or Non-Compliant)

- I-A-001 Safety/Sanitation/Inspections (MANDATORY): Compliant- Inspections of the facility are being conducted. FM inspection was done on 5/26/23, DHH inspections done on 2/27/23 & 2/28/23 with no discrepancies.
- I-C-001 Emergency Plan (MANDATORY): Compliant- Facility has an emergency plan in place and is sent to the FM for approval. Once approved a copy will be sent to DPS&C.

- **II-A-006** Staff Log (MANDATORY): Compliant- Staff logs are kept on a computer database to show employees assigned to the shift for that particular day.

- **II-A-008** Offender Population Management System: Compliant- The facility has a computer program that has the names and housing locations along with work locations of all inmates at the facility.
- **II-A-010** Admissions: Compliant- Offenders property searched during admissions. Fingerprints and photos are taken upon admission. A booking checklist is conducted and offenders sign and receive handbook during this process.

Once received the Warden will review the inmate criminal history, disciplinary records, amount of time being served and any medical and mental health issues in order to consider the inmate for trustee status.

The Warden was made aware and will get with staff working in the shop to clean up and get tools on inventory. The staff working the shop does not work directly under the Warden. Staff is under the supervision of the Sheriff's office. There are some offenders working in the shop area.

- What is their restoration of good time application process for the offender population? The inmate can request the form for restoration of good time. Once completed it will be sent to the Warden for review and verified. Once reviewed and approved then it will be forwarded to DPS&C.

The facility has done a lot of renovations over the past year or so throughout the facility which is a major improvement to the quality of life of inmates and a better work environment for employees.

OFFENDER COMMENTS/MORALE/QUALITY OF LIFE:

Spoke to DOC inmates housed at the facility. The inmate quality of life and morale seem to be good. There were no issues or concerns voiced about being housed at the facility.

RECOMMENDATION:

Due to the improvements and upgrades to the facility at this time recertification with a waiver is recommended with continued annual monitoring.

L.R.S. 40:1577 APPEAL FROM ORDER

When an order is made by one of the deputies or representatives of the Fire Marshal, the owner or occupant of the building or premises may, within three days, appeal to the Fire Marshal. The Fire Marshal shall, within five days, review the order and advise the owner or occupant of his decision thereon. The owner or occupant may, within five days after the making of affirming of any such order of the Fire Marshal, file an application with the Board of Review.

RULES FOR APPEALING TO THE FIRE MARSHAL BOARD OF REVIEW

- I. Any application to the Board of Review shall contain the following basic information set off in organized fashion with captions indicating that the paragraph in question contains the following basic information.
 - 1. The name of the applicant.
 - 2. A brief description of the facts.
 - 3. A copy of the order of the Fire Marshal which is being appealed.
 - 4. A reference to the section of the law or code being reviewed.
 - A brief description of why the applicant feels the requirements of the Fire Marshal is not within the Fire Marshal's authority, or brief description of why the interpretation of the Fire Marshal is incorrect or what specific relief is required by the applicant.
 - A list of the individuals who will be appearing before the Board, and a brief description of the testimony
 or information they will be providing the Board.
 - A list of all the documents which will be introduced or provided to the Board along with a brief description of the documents, and if possible, a copy of said documents.
 - 8. A list of each exhibit except for documents, and a brief description of the exhibit.
- II. Whenever possible, a notice of the meeting, date and place, and the agenda will be recorded in the Louisiana Register, however, whenever that is not possible, a copy of the meeting notice including the date, time and place, and agenda of the meeting of the Board will be published in the official notices of the official state journal; furthermore, a press release containing the same information will be mailed to the official journals of the cities of Shreveport, Monroe, Lafayette, Lake Charles, Alexandria, New Orleans, and Baton Rouge and any city or town in which the meeting of the Board is to be held if it is not one of the aforementioned major cities; and the same information shall be mailed to each individual who has notified the Fire Marshal of his desire to receive a notice of such appeal.
- III. A copy of the determination of the Board as prepared by the Chairman will be mailed to each individual who requests a copy of that specific determination as well as to the applicant.
- IV. The time delays for filing an appeal shall be those specified in R.S.40:1577 and 40:1578 1 D.

NOTICE RS 40:31.38 (ACT 66)

RS 40:31.38 (ACT 66) authorizes the Louisiana Department of Health to charge a fee of \$150 to any permitted facility that fails to correct the necessary sanitary code violations to be in compliance at the time of its follow up inspection (1st re-inspection). Re-inspections are required when there are five or more uncorrected non-critical violations and/or one or more uncorrected critical violations remaining at the conclusion of an inspection. The fee is only charged if the necessary violations are not corrected before the 2nd re-inspection and other subsequent re-inspections. Facilities can avoid this fee if the violations noted on the routine inspection report are corrected by, or during, the follow up inspection. If a fee is assessed, the \$150 fee is payable within 30 days' notice, and failure to pay shall result in revocation of the permit.
