GENERAL APPERANCE, CLEANLINESS, AND COMMENTS OF THE FACILITY:

Living Area:

- **Dorms** There are no dormitory at this facility. All areas consist of cell blocks appeared to be clean.
- Cell Block The cells were clean and odor free. All of the inmates' personal property was neatly stored and the cells were clutter free.

Culinary/Dining: The culinary area were clean. Culinary tools were appropriately inventoried with check-out systems in place.

Bathrooms: The bathrooms were found to be clean, odor free and in working order. Lavatory/showers have temperature controlled hot/cold water and the temperatures are checked.

Yard Areas: The exercise yard is located on top of the courthouse on the fourth floor. It's fenced in all around sides and on the top. When inmates are out for recreation staff monitors inmates continuously while inmates on the yard.

Maintenance: All tools are provided by employee who is hired by the Police Jury and performs all general maintenance that is needed at the jail. There are no tools kept in the jail.

STAFF COMMENTS/MORALE/GENERAL OBSERVATIONS:

I spoke with staff members and found that they were professional and dedicated to their jobs. The facility is small, staff members assist each other with daily scheduled assignments so that the facility runs smoothly. No employee expressed any concerns. Based upon my observation morale seems to be high. The employees at this jail work very efficiently.

OFFENDER COMMENTS/MORALE/QUALITY OF LIFE:

I spoke with several inmates. They were polite and welled mannered during the inspection. Inmate/staff interactions observed were mutually polite and respectful. I spoke with several inmates doing the walk through inspection. There were no complaints about the food that is served. Several inmates stated that they are ready to move to the new facility because of the out dated structure of the facility. Overall, inmate's comments were positive in nature.

RECOMMENDATION:

Warden Orlan Davidson and staff are committed to maintaining compliance with BJG guidelines and providing a safe, secure, and stable environment for the inmates in their custody. It is recommended that Webster Parish Jail remain on annual monitoring. *Webster Parish Jail has been approved for a new facility.*

RS 40:31.38 (ACT 66) authorizes the Louisiana Department of Health to charge a fee of \$150 to any permitted facility that fails to correct the necessary sanitary code violations to be in compliance at the time of its follow up inspection (1st re-inspection). Reinspections are required when there are five or more uncorrected non-critical violations and/or one or more uncorrected critical violations remaining at the conclusion of an inspection. I am writing to you in regards to the new parish jail that the Webster Parish Police Jury, in conjunction with the WPSO, will be constructing to replace the current facility that is located on the 4th floor of the Webster Parish Courthouse. The current facility is obsolete, and presents many problems to the effective and efficient operation of the Courthouse.

The current capacity of the jail is 61, comprised entirely of female offenders. The proposed capacity of the new facility will be 65. The majority of the offenders are Webster Parish pretrial offenders, sentenced misdemeanor offenders, and pretrial offenders housed for neighboring jurisdictions. We also house a number of DOC offenders at this time, the majority of which are involved in TWP and substance abuse programs. We understand that the DOC population will be affected when the new state facility comes online.

The intent of the new construction is to replace an aging, out of date facility with a modern, efficient structure. The increase in capacity is incidental to this overall goal, not the purpose. Therefore, in accordance with 8JG-VII-B-12, we are requesting DOC approval for this modest increase.

The WPPJ and WPSO are hoping that this new facility will be operational by 12/31/23. It will be constructed on property already owned by the WPPJ that is well suited in the community for such use, as it formerly contained the men's facility before BDCC was built.

A request for approval has been submitted to the LSA.
